Ty March has always been someone who has believed that believing in yourself is the key factor to being successful at whatever it is you want to be successful at

Ty, now 26, fell in love with Country music as a little kid thanks to George Jones and Garth Brooks cassettes.... and his Dad's 1991 Isuzu Trooper

At a young age he was also very passionate about playing the guitar, until he finally got one for his 8th birthday and..... hated it. At a second attempt to fulfill his young musical impulse, his Mom and Dad bought him a heavily used drum set out of some random grunge rockers garage in Ty's hometown of Bolling Springs, PA.

In his early teens, Ty played drums in a pop punk band that played Blink 182 covers and Blink 182 rip off originals. At the age of 17, Ty went on his first self-booked summer tour across the United States in that very same band.

Three pretty bad self-booked summer tours later, at the age of 21, Ty found himself on a 24-hour flight to Australia to start playing drums for a newly formed Metal core band called Capture The Crown. In December 2011, CTC released a video, for a song Ty co-wrote with other members of the band that went insanely viral on YouTube reaching over a couple million views in the first couple weeks. The band found instant success playing in front of a couple thousand people every night at festivals like SXSW and on tour with bigger bands in the genre like Of Mice and Men and Attila.

At 24 years old, Ty was living his teenage dream until one day on the road with CTC he picked up an LTD acoustic that one of the bands guitarists had lying around the bus and just for fun randomly started writing country songs. These new songs slowly overtook his passion for his band and Ty found himself falling back into the shotgun seat of that 91 Trooper, his roots.

Currently, Ty is living in Nashville, TN pursuing a career in country music, building his online brand, writing every single day, and starting to find his niche of buddies and hit writers here in town that are right for him. So far, Ty has written country/pop songs with over 2 million views on YouTube (Ryan Robinette - For Awhile), has built up an online fan base of 94 thousand Instagram followers, 54 thousand followers on Twitter, and currently has around 30,000 listeners on Spotify each month.

Ty believes that this only the start of a very long successful career in country music.

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
